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## 1. Introduction

Jeevan Bikas samaj (JBS) is a Non-Governmental Organization established in 1997 A.D. which is a non-partisan, non-political, non-profitable and non religious organization serving the backward, disadvantaged and resource poor community members in Nepal. The ethical framework of the organization incorporates values of Humanity, Commitment, Solidarity and Empowerment.

JBS is currently operating its program in seven districts of Nepal: Morang, Jhapa, Illam, Sunsari, Dhankuta, Udayapur and Sindhuli. It envisions a “Poverty free Nepal “with healthy rural civilizations so the organization has implemented various developmental programs that impart long term community growth and economic development which are nationally recognized programs like education, health, agriculture, housing and energy.

## 2. Target groups

### 3. Objectives of the project

- Provide quality, affordable education.
- Stop child marriages by keeping girls in school.
- Provide skills training and capacity building including leadership development especially for girl students.
- Provide an online platform to search for vocational information.
- Provide career counseling.
- Provide information related to health, sanitation and sexual awareness to students.
- Provide micro savings facilities so that children can learn the importance of savings.
- Create an award fund to promote and encourage government and non government organizations who are working on the similar sector.

### 4. Program Operation Process

- JBS established a JBS Sustainable Development Fund of US\$600,000 (In words: Six Hundred Thousand Dollar) which is US\$ 300,000 (In words: Three Hundred Thousand Dollar) from AGFUND Prize and US\$ 300,000 (In words: Six Hundred Thousand Dollar) by itself.
- NRS.50, 000,000(In words: Five Hundred Thousand Dollar) (approx.US\$ 438,280 at current currency conversion date as of 2020/02/16) amount kept Fixed Deposit in Bank at (trending) interest rate.

- Quarterly interest\* of 9.6% is earning from fixed deposit of Nrs.50, 000,000 (In words: Fifty Million only). The interest earnings are adding to the JBS Sustainable Development Fund.
- \*Interest rate may differ as per time.
- On the first stage of fund spending, JBS primarily spend for quality education and also will support to achieve SDGs which are identified by Government of Nepal.
- The activities followed by JBS sustainable development goals are implementing only after approval from executive body of JBS.
- Major activities followed in First stage:

***Component 1: Providing modern, affordable education in rural areas-Jeevan Bikas Public School***

- Identification of those children's who do not have access to school and quality education.
- Arrange teacher's trainings.
- Arrange additional teachers if required for level upgrade in quality education.
- Make available of educational and technical materials.
- Arrange school visit and education tour.

***Component 2: Enabling lifelong learning in rural areas***

***A. Jeevan Bikas Child Education Program***

- Identification of places where there is no access of school and quality education for the operation of child education program
- Agreement with local government for implementation and expansion of program.
- Collaboration with community school for the teacher training and also co-operation on other identified areas to build sample child classroom.
- To upgrading community child classroom organization will arrange teacher .For the time period and benefits of the teacher depends upon the understanding between the local government and school itself.

- Organization will provide teachers training and child friendly content to build sample child classroom.

**B. Vocational Training Program**

- To develop skill and create employment.
- Memorandum of Understanding with local government for expansion and implementation of the program.
- Memorandum of Understanding with different community school to operate Montessori Education training and including assigned training to required areas.
- Even trainings for community school teachers are arrange to upgrade child classroom of community school.

**Component 3: JBS Youth Micro finance ( Nawa Bihani)**

- Memorandum of Understanding with local government or related school to implement program.
- Memorandum of Understanding between School, Local government and JBS to conduct the program with a clear understanding of the roles.
- Operate workshop and trainings to build capacity of related school principle and focal teacher.
- Build girls group studying on school ages between 12 to 18 yrs.
- Conduct trainings and program on define objectives and goals for ability enhancement.
- Trainings for students and parents to increase self confidence, self reliant.
- Overview of successful exemplary practice at inter district and out of district for the involved girls, principle and teachers.

**Component 4: Enhancing quality of government schools**

- The required programs will operate for the improvement of backward community school and trust (Jeevan Bikas Educational Trust including other school) in collaboration with government of Nepal and local government. School

management improvement campaign will operate through management school of community school for overall increase in educational quality of school.

- Required training and educational content will be provided to school for quality enhancement after Monitoring school.
- Consultation service and scholarship program will be provided to school.
- Extra activities will operate and if necessary required support will be provided.
- Feasibility study can be done for vocational training .Teaching can started on public private partnership model (PPP model), also provide required support.

***Component 5: JBS SDG Award***

- JBS will arrange award equivalent to amount Rs.100000 (Rs.1 million) support to achieve Nepal Government Goals through Jeevan Bikas SDG Award.
- Active associations, organizations, bodies and individuals especially who work for the achievement of sustainable development goals are encourage through Jeevan Bikas SDG Award.
- Jeevan Bikas SDG Award procedure will apply after the approval from executive committee of JBS.

***Sustainable development programs:***

- JBS will prepare and apply different programs to support on sustainable development goals achievement which are taken by Nepal government.
- JBS itself or on co-operation with active associations, organizations, bodies and individuals especially who work for the achievement of sustainable development goals can design program and prepare budget which can be applied after approval of executive committee .



## 5. Background of the Project

JBS has been implementing the project “Accelerating a sustainable solution for quality education” that focuses on developing the ecosystem for increasing access to education for the people in the rural areas of Nepal. The project is focusing on developing both parts of the ecosystem: the hard infrastructure (the child friendly infrastructures, and facilities, etc) as well as the soft infrastructure( the teachers and human resources, course curriculum and content, assess to finance for the students/parents, etc). The project activities associated with both the hard infrastructure as well as the soft infrastructures aspects will significant impact aligned with all the 3 dimensions of the SDG fourth goal: Inclusive Education, Quality education and Lifelong Learning.

The 5 integrated components of the JBS project are:

Project component 1: Providing modern, affordable education in rural areas.

Project component 2: Enabling lifelong learning in rural areas.

Project Component 3: JBS Youth Microfinance Program (Nawa Bihani).

Project component 4: Enhancing quality of Government schools.

Project component 5: JBS Prize for Sustainable Development.

In order to expand the project, JBS create a Project Fund Pool of US\$600,000 named JBS sustainable Development Fund, 2075 B.S. for the continuous implementation of the project.

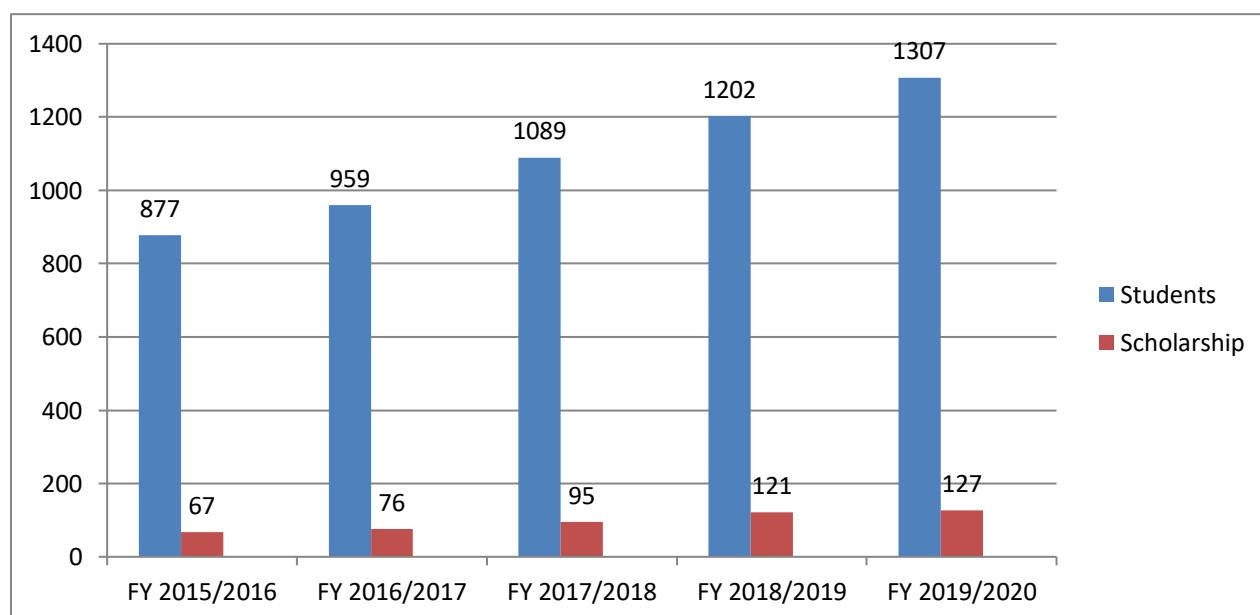

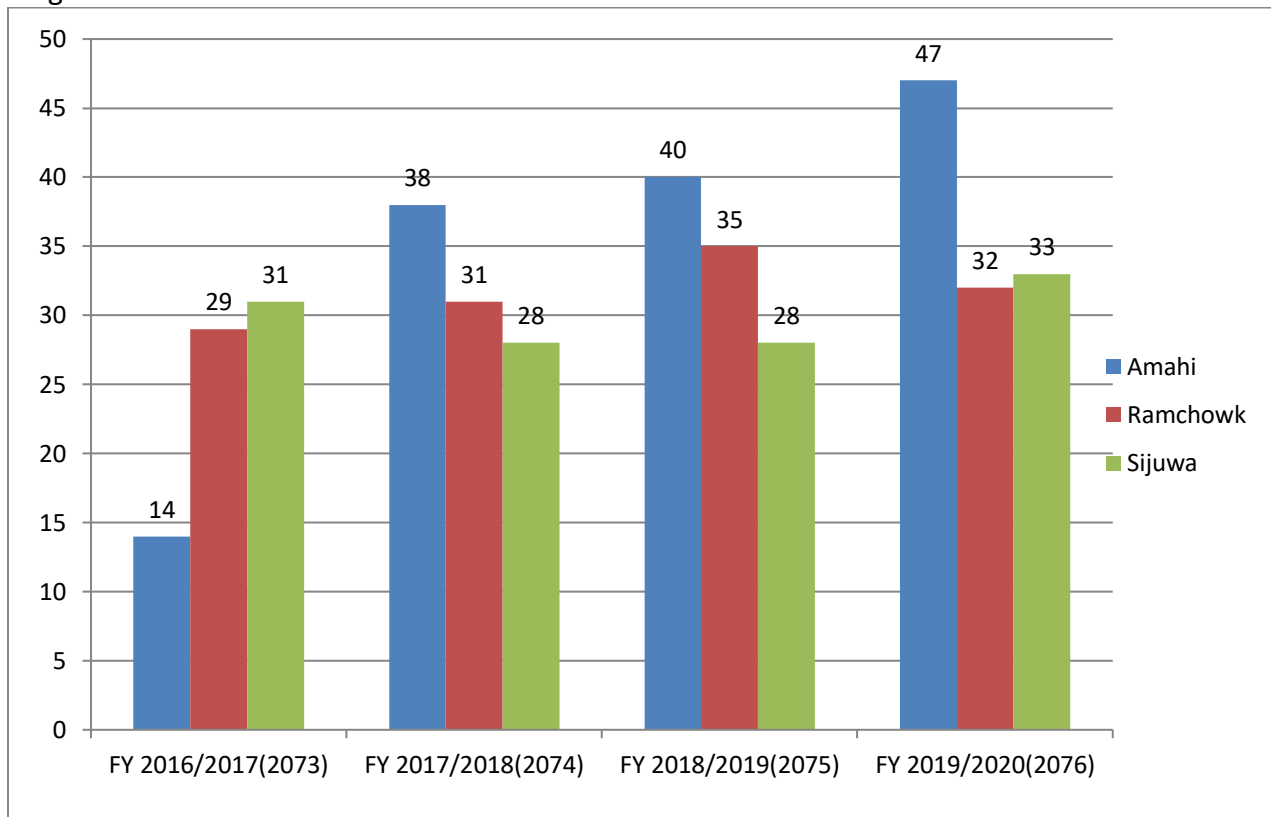

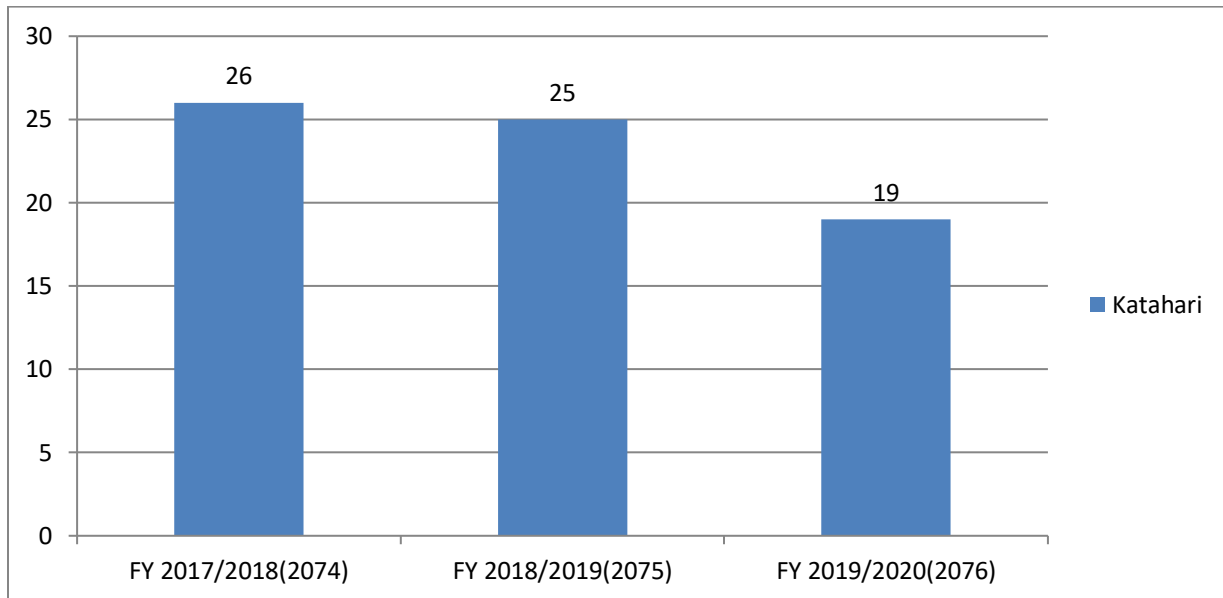
Chart 2: Component 2 .Enabling lifelong learning in rural areas: a) Jeevan Bikas Child Education Program

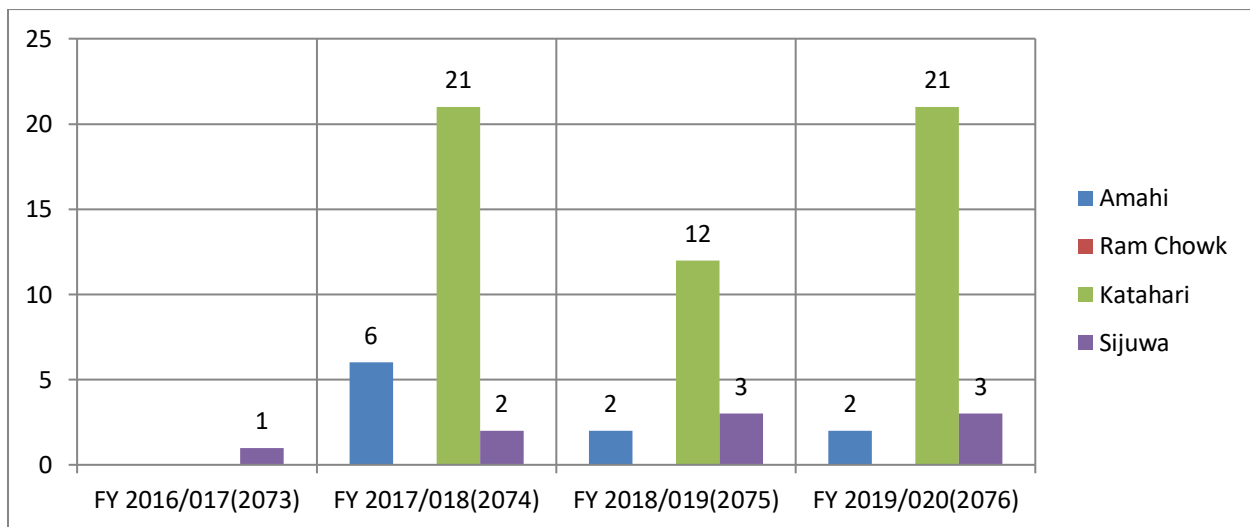


Chart 3: Child education program based on community: Rishidev Community



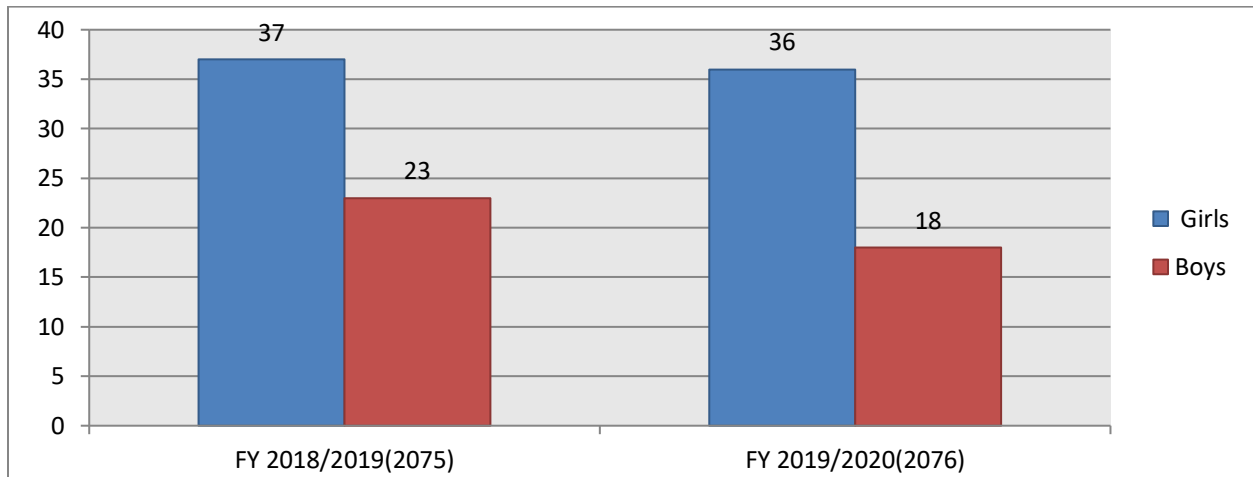

Chart 4: Rishidev community student at four different branches



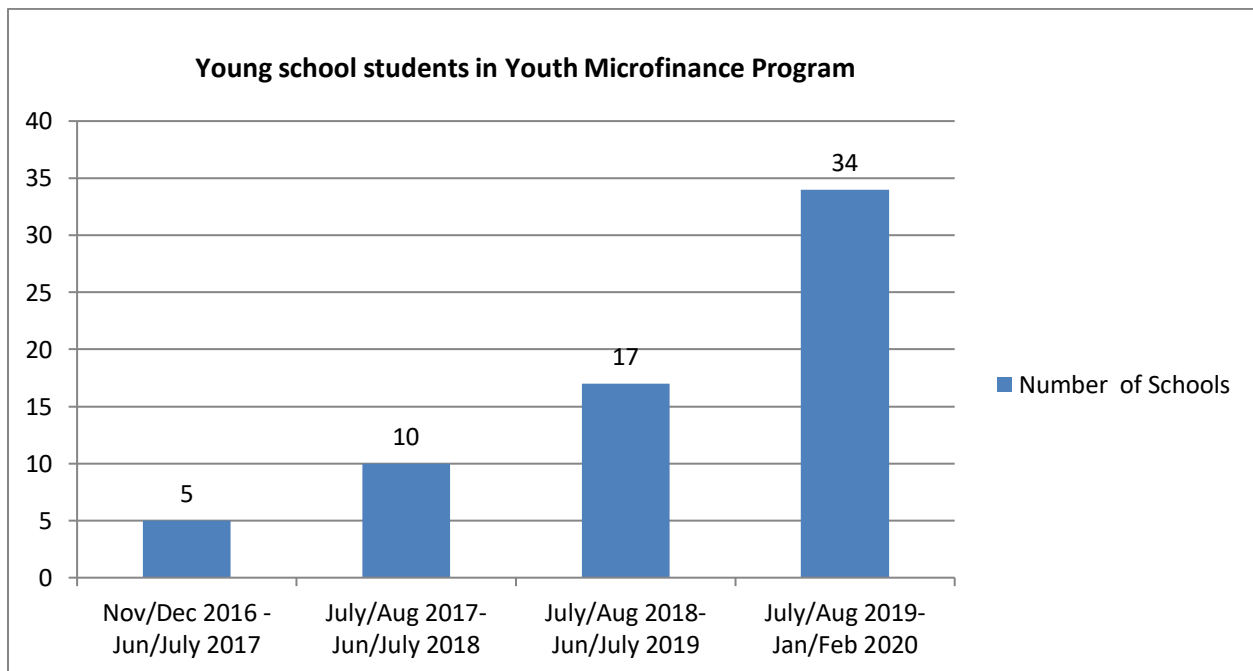
The numbers of rishidev students attending the child education program are high at Amahi and Sijuwa area. The students are provided with all the basic facilities for education at very low cost.

Nawa Bihani program have been running in various schools and the number of schools are increasing as the program is creating positive impacts within the community and more girls are interested to be part of the program.

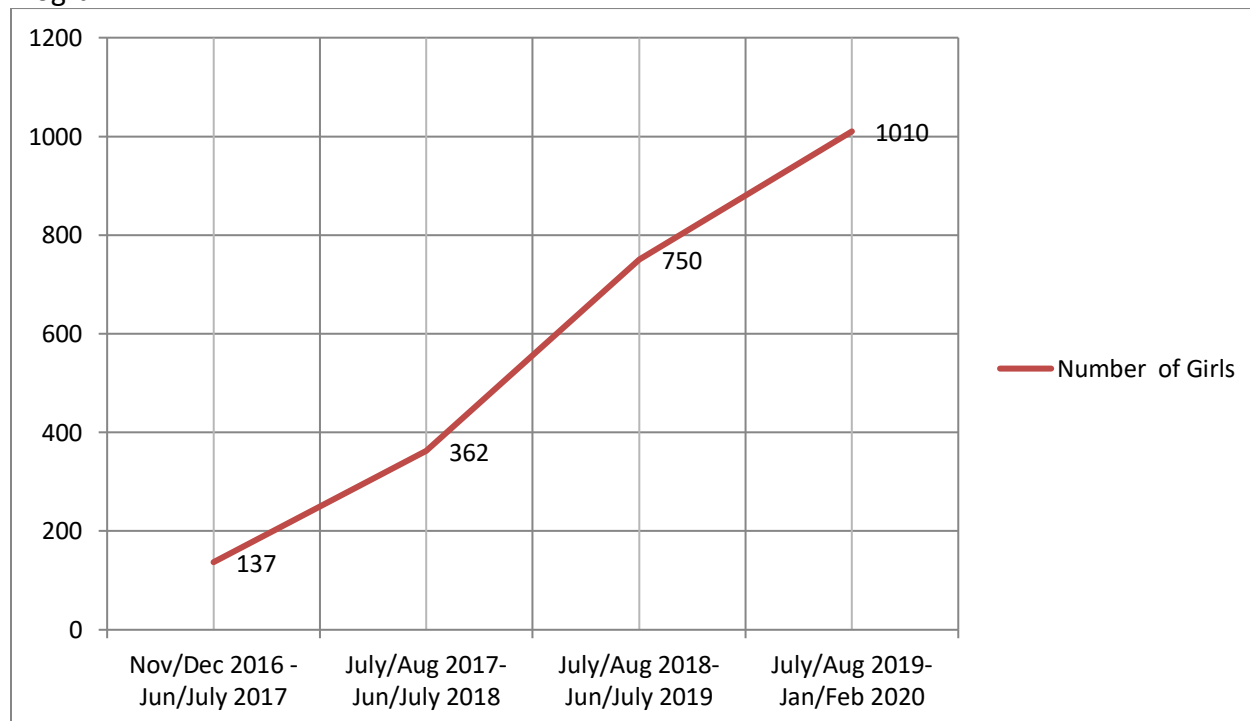

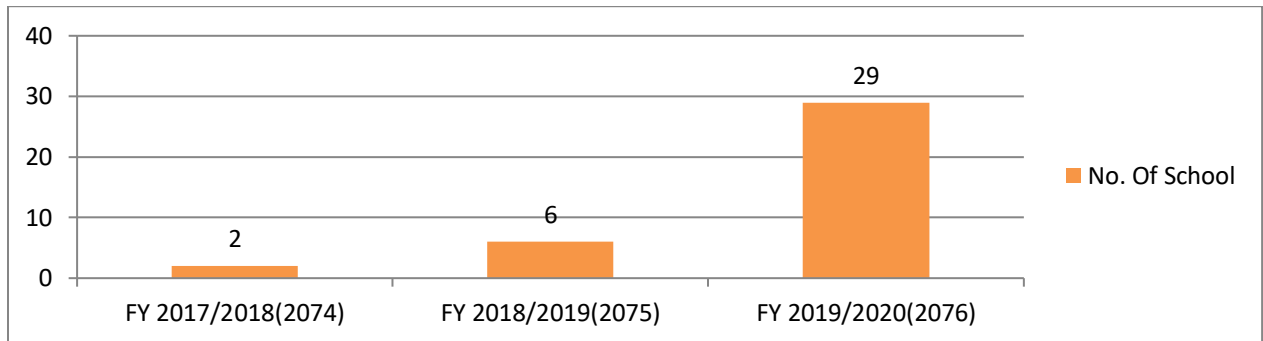

Chart 7: Component 3. Number of young school students enrolled in the Youth Microfinance Program



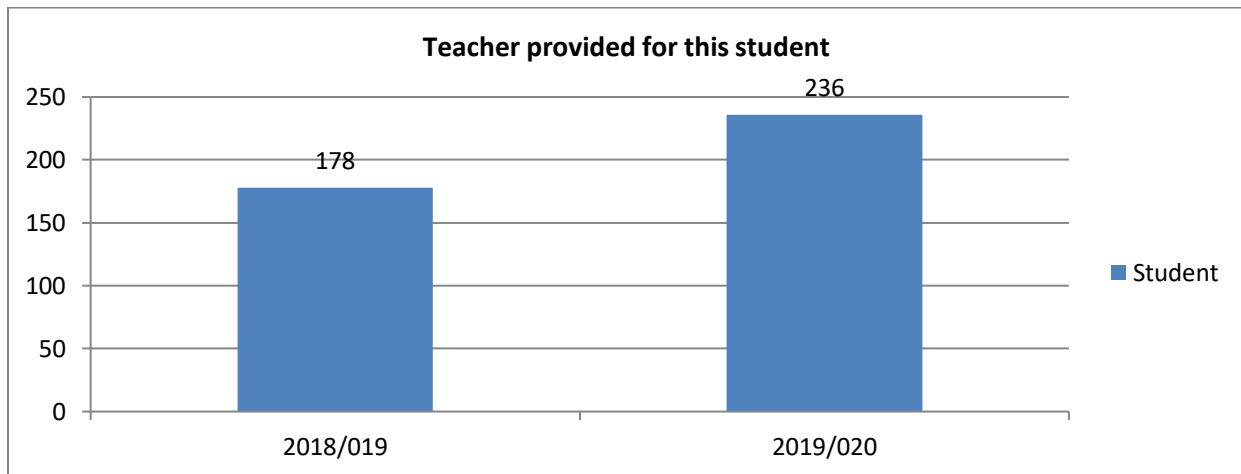

## 9. Problems/Feedback

- 1. The demand for number of scholarship provided is increasing from the community with increasing number of students in schools.*
- 2. Montessori based child education program needs to be increased to several other rural areas.*
- 3. The training provided from Jeevan Bikas Samaj for vocational education needs to be increased with new courses as demand from the community.*
- 4. Government schools have been provided support for infrastructure and education improvement and the demand from other schools are also high.*
- 5. Nawa bihani program should be implemented in other various schools and more facilitator is required for the program.*
